

## FROM THE RABBI

Friends,

We have had the privilege of celebrating Shabbat and many holidays with the Jewish students at IU this year. We began the year with Rosh Hashanah and ending with Simchat Torah. During Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur we focused on ourselves and our own lives. We looked inward in order to improve our lives, to better ourselves in the coming year. We then moved immediately into Sukkot during which time we built our sukkah. The sukkah is an open structure and quite fragile. We couldn't help but see the world around us and think about our connection to nature and to our community. I think that it is quite significant that we moved from focusing on bettering ourselves to then confronting our responsibility to our world community and our environment.

I can't help but believe that our students clearly understand the message that we have a responsibility to work together to build a more just and fair community. We just celebrated a mitzvah corps Shabbat. The students reiterated their commitment to doing community service both on a local and global level. On a local level we have organized a blood drive, had fundraisers for "Save a Child's Heart", and volunteered at local organizations. On a national and global level, we are planning three alternative break trips. Our trip locations include New Orleans, an organic farm in California, and South America. The students truly understand that we invest our everyday lives with meaning and sanctity through our actions. The holiness of our world is found in the way we treat our poor, our children, our environment and our world. Rashi, a medieval commentator, said that "holiness" is a promise and not a command". It is a promise that if we live our lives and act in the ways that are laid out for us in our Jewish tradition, then we will find holiness and meaning. Basically, the way to a holy community is through our acts of tzedek—righteousness and justice. I am so proud of the tzedek work that our students have embarked upon so far this year and look forward to their continued partnership in making our world a better place.
